What exactly is 1XL Ventures, and why was it created?

Dr. Dhiraj Jain: 1XL Ventures is a growth-focused venture platform that helps businesses with proven products scale sustainably. Many strong businesses struggle not because of the product but because of inconsistent leads, unclear marketing systems, and limited room to experiment. Why should a founder consider becoming a portfolio company of 1XL Ventures?

Dr. Mamata Jain: Instead of burning cash on trial-and-error marketing, founders gain access to a ready-made growth engine. We bring structure, go-to-market enablement, solid marketing systems, and investor discipline, allowing founders to focus on delivery while we handle scaling the business.



What does 1XL Ventures actually do for portfolio companies?

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
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V Legal & the Man Behind the Mission

A Candid Conversation with Founder Vishal Tinani

At what moment did you realise you were building something far larger than a law practice?

I believe the realisation wasn't a single moment; it developed over the years. Growing up in Vadodara grounded me, but moving into the UAE expanded my perspective. Early in my career, I saw how the right legal strategy could alter the course of businesses, families, and even entire communities. That's when it became clear that I wasn't just practising law; I was creating a platform for impact. The journey was built "case by case, client by client," growing quietly but with purpose.

Your recent interview with Anjana Om Kashyap garnered significant attention. What did that moment represent for you?

Speaking with Anjana was more than a media appearance; it was a chance

to talk openly about the evolving legal landscape in the UAE, migrant worker challenges, and how young professionals can bridge understanding between India and the UAE. Her ability to draw out personal reflections made the interview feel like a milestone, not just a feature. It reflected how far the journey has travelled beyond courtrooms.

You were recently honoured on stage by Raghav Chadha. How did that recognition influence your perspective?

Being presented with an award by Raghav Chadha, a public figure many young professionals admire, was humbling. For me, the moment symbolised responsibility more than achievement. Recognition is encouraging, but it's also a reminder to continue contributing meaningfully to the Indo-UAE corridor and to the people who place trust in my work.

Many people don't know about your humanitarian work. You've helped more than 100 detainees return home. How did that become part of your mission?

This is the part of my career that remains closest to my heart. Over the last few years, I have encountered dozens of detainees caught in situations ranging from labour disputes to documentation errors, including credit card defaults. Many had no representation or understanding of the legal process. Helping over 100 of them secure release and reunite with their families wasn't philanthropy; it was duty. Those cases reminded me that the law exists for people first, not paperwork.

Let's talk about V Legal. What was your vision when you founded the firm?

V Legal was born from a very simple yet powerful realisation that clients don't just want legal answers; they want strategic partners.

Today, we advise on corporate law, M&A, white-collar crimes, dispute resolution, insurance, cyber law, AI, and blockchain. But at our core, we're a people-first consultancy that blends traditional legal depth with the future of business.

Your work spans boardrooms, high-stakes disputes, and humanitarian efforts. What drives this balance?

Law isn't linear. One day, you're drafting a multimillion-dirham agreement, and the next, you're negotiating a detainee's release. The balance comes from understanding that legal impact wears different faces. Corporate clients shape industries. Detainees shape families. Both deserve commitment.

The UAE is known for its regulatory depth, diversity, and pace of change. What are some of the biggest challenges and opportunities you've seen while working here?

The UAE's legal landscape is layered, combining federal law, emirate-specific regulations, and free-zone frameworks, a complexity I've highlighted often. But that complexity is also what makes the UAE thrive. Its cultural respect, speed of legal reform, and global ambition make it a unique place to practice law. The key is agility: businesses and lawyers must evolve as fast as the country does.

You have a reputation for being approachable yet extremely detail-oriented. What guiding principles have shaped your growth?

My guiding principles remain consistent:

- Integrity isn't negotiable.
- Bridge the gap between law and technology.
- People over profits.
- And never stop learning.

These aren't just mantras, they're habits that shape every case and client relationship.

Bookings for the Ahmedabad-Sharjah flights are now open across SpiceJet's website, mobile app, and authorised travel partners.





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

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

Installation 1st Green hydrogen plant and Asia's largest galvanising kettle

Among KP Group's recent milestones is the installation of its **first green hydrogen plant** at Bharuch, Gujarat (Green hydrogen is a clean hydrogen made using renewable electricity instead of fossil fuels). What makes this milestone particularly significant is **green hydrogen integration Asia's largest galvanising kettle** (galvanising is a critical manufacturing process that protects steel) which was recently installed at the Group's Matar facility in Bharuch. At KP Group, nearly half of the green hydrogen will be used for galvanising. KP Group has created a rare combination of scale, efficiency and sustainability within its manufacturing operations.

Today, KP Group operates 128 project sites, backed by a portfolio of 6.57 + GW of solar, wind, BESS and hybrid power, and a land bank exceeding 11,890 acres. It aims to cross 10 GW capacity by 2030.

KP Group: Growing Across India and Beyond

KP Group's expansion today spans key regions outside its Gujarat base across India's renewable energy landscape.

While Gujarat remains its strong base, KP Group's growth story today stretches far beyond. **Odisha** is emerging as another key hub, with large renewable energy parks under development through state-backed memorandums of understanding. In **Maharashtra**, KP Group has secured a 100 MW solar project from MAHAGENCO, strengthening its presence in western India.

Diversification is another hallmark of the Group's journey. KP Green Engineering Ltd. recently secured its largest-ever order from BSNL, executing telecom infrastructure projects across **Maharashtra, Goa, Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh**—showcasing the Group's ability to deliver at scale, across terrains and sectors.

Looking beyond Indian borders

Internationally, KP Group is advancing renewable energy initiatives in **Botswana**, including proposals for up to **5 GW of projects**, while building partnerships across UAE and South Korea in areas such as green hydrogen, energy storage and advanced power electronics.

As KP Group expands across India and overseas, sustainability remains at the core—powering growth today while shaping a cleaner tomorrow.

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


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


It is both meditative and exhilarating—a sensory journey that leaves a lasting impression.

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


When Landmarks Become Living Art

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
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


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MUMBAI

FROM SEA TO SEA

MEENAKSHI J.

Mumbai wakes to the sound of waves at Juhu and goes to sleep under the lights of the Gateway of India.

Between the two, it unfolds the history of its seven islands, its regional flavours, Art Deco elegance, and the ever-present shimmer of the silver screen.



1 SUNRISE AT JUHU

Early morning is the best time for a walk or jog along Juhu beach. Fishermen are already sorting their nets, regulars are out on the sand, and the tea stalls are opening for the day. A cup of cutting chai, sometimes with a vada pav from a nearby vendor, is a simple way to begin. Before traffic and visitors arrive in earnest, the beach still feels like a lived-in neighbourhood rather than a backdrop to the world of the silver screen. If you prefer a sit-down start, there's Prithvi Café a short distance away, where coffee, omelettes, parathas and toast are served under a canopy of old trees, and the tables are usually shared by students, upcoming actors, and early risers easing into the day.





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2 HISTORY ON THE GO

Nearby, the spire of the ISKCON temple rises above the trees. Here, the morning *aarti*, with its steady chanting and flow of devotees, allows space for a pause before the day gathers pace. A brief stroll inland leads into the lanes of old Juhu village. On a heritage walk with Shilahara Heritage Services and local historian Sandeep Dahisarkar, you pass Koli homes and small shrines, and hear how this fishing hamlet, once called Juvem, grew around the sea long before film studios and sea-facing apartments arrived.

3 FROM PAST TO PRESENT

The drive east takes you into Bandra Kurla Complex (BKC), where wide roads and glass buildings signal a newer Mumbai. At the Nita Mukesh Ambani Cultural Centre precinct, performance spaces, galleries, and public art sit alongside office towers and busy cafés. A wander here gives a sense of how the city's cultural life now shares space with its financial side.

4 LUNCH IN THE MILL DISTRICT

It's early afternoon, and the

route turns south into the old mill neighbourhoods of Lower Parel and Worli.

Red-brick chimneys and former warehouses now house restaurants, making this a natural halt for

lunch. A vegetarian thali at Maharaja Bhog, served in a sequence of small golden-hued bowls with fresh rotis and sweets, offers a generous, unhurried meal, and a chance to linger before the second half of the day





5 MUSEUM WATCH & IRANI TEA BREAK

A visit to the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya—or, Bombay Museum—brings a change of tempo. With its shaded gardens and cool galleries of miniature paintings, sculptures, and decorative arts, it's a great place to slow down. Follow up with a refreshing stop at the century-old Britannia & Co., for a hot beverage and something light. This Irani café, with its high ceilings and wooden chairs, is ideal for a cup of *chai* and a small portion of berry pulao or caramel custard, less a meal than a relaxing pitstop — before moving on, don't miss reading the café's old, slightly eccentric, signboards and notices.

6 AROUND THE GATEWAY AND COLABA...

By the time you reach Colaba, the heat of the day has softened. This is a practical hour to walk across the open forecourt of the Gateway of India, before the area is cordoned off for the evening. Ferries move in and out of the harbour and visitors break for photographs, while the stone arch—



part working waterfront, part historical marker — faces the sea, as it has done for more than a century. A short amble away, Colaba Causeway invites one to stay, with its street stalls displaying silver jewellery, scarves and small souvenirs, and cafés filling with people catching their breath after a busy day.

7 ...AND ALONG THE QUEEN'S NECKLACE

From Colaba, the road curves back along the western edge of the island to Marine Drive. At dusk, people gather along the promenade, sitting on the parapet or the tetrapods by the water, with cups of tea and paper cones of bhel, watching the sky darken over the sea. Traffic continues behind you but the promenade keeps a measured rhythm. The Art Deco

buildings catch the last of the light, and as night settles, the lamps come on one by one, tracing the familiar arc of the Queen's Necklace.

8 A SLICE BY THE BAY

Dinner at Pizza By The Bay is the perfect way to end the evening, the tables here facing the water and the hum of Mumbai life around you. And if there is room for something sweet, the drive north brings you to Haji Ali. Even late at night, the stretch outside the dargah is active, and the fruit-cream stalls continue to serve chilled bowls of custard layered with chopped apples, bananas, strawberries, and pomegranate. People stand by on the pavement eating quietly, the shrine lit in the distance and the sea close by ●



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DHARAMSHALA

for the discerning

CHANDREYI BANDYOPADHYAY

A Himalayan town shaped by faith and art, and a gateway to trails surrounded by tall pines and wildflowers, Dharamshala makes for a charming getaway.



Qmbraced by cedar forests and cloud-wrapped ridges, Dharamshala presents a rare balance of spiritual depth and crisp mountain air. Best known as the home of His Holiness Dalai Lama, the town carries the quiet rhythms of Tibetan Buddhism — prayer flags flutter across nearby McLeodganj, monks debate philosophy in temple courtyards, and the scent of incense drifts through narrow lanes. Trails begin where roads end, with immersive forest walks to Bhagsu Nag and longer treks towards Triund and Indrahar Pass, through gentle village paths that allows you a peek into the lives of the Gaddi shepherds of Himachal Pradesh.



IN AND AROUND

Begin in lower Dharamshala, where the pace is mellower and the layers of culture unfold quietly. A visit to the Norbulingka Institute — part monastery, part living museum, dedicated to preserving Tibetan arts — is a must. Set amid landscaped gardens and water channels, it houses workshops where Thangka painters, wood carvers and metal craftsmen work with meditative focus. The Losel Doll Museum gives an insight into Tibetan costumes, and the War Memorial and tea gardens allow for a reflective pause, while short walks in the woods around Sidhbari reveal picture-perfect views of the Dhauladars.

Dharamshala rewards those who linger, through conversations with locals, unhurried market strolls, and evenings when the mountains turn pink in the setting sun's myriad hues. It also provides access to other destinations like Palampur, with its tea estates, and Bir Billing, the country's paragliding hub.

MCLEODGANJ & BEYOND

A short drive uphill brings you to McLeodganj, Dharamshala's most cosmopolitan quarter. Drop in at the Tsuglagkhang Complex, where the Dalai Lama's temple, museum, and prayer halls draw pilgrims and seekers alike — or at St. John in the Wilderness Church, for a few meditative moments. Nearby is Bhagsu Nag, where the waterfall comes to life after the monsoon. On the way back, take a detour to Naddi for sunset, or Dal Lake (yes, a local one!) for a brief lakeside amble. These stops add texture to your day, unveiling the many treasures of nature and faith, all in one place.

DOWN KANGRA VALLEY

Set aside a day to descend into the fertile Kangra Valley, where history and landscape shift dramatically. Kangra Fort, one of India's oldest, reveals itself through portals and courtyards overlooking the Banganga river, its scale and setting alone worth the visit.

Not too far away, the rock-cut Masroor temples rise dramatically from the earth, their monolithic forms echoing Ellora in miniature. While local legends say that the Pandavas built Masroor in just one night, historians have dated the structures to the early 8th century. And nearby is Bajreshwari Mata Temple, or Kangra Devi, one of

the 51 Shakti Peethas, renowned for its ancient origins and enduring spiritual significance.

If time allows, continue to Pragpur, India's first heritage village, where cobbled lanes, old timber havelis with stained-glass windows, and mustard fields evoke a slower era, that of India's early timber merchants. Alternatively, head to the Maharana Pratap Sagar (Pong) Dam, especially in winter, when migratory species transform the wetlands into a paradise for birdwatchers.

CAFÉ CULTURE


The city's relaxed café culture, shaped by artists, writers and long-stay travellers, is as refreshing as its

mountain air, offering warm brews, artisan bakes, and convivial corners that cater to every type of visitor — from the wanderer seeking slow mornings to the digital nomad setting up shop with a view. Cafés line the main square and upper trails, perfect spaces for people-watching, admiring the majestic Himalayan views, and seeing clouds dive in late in the afternoons. Skol Culture and Pahari Café weave art, music, and conversation into their menus. Bakery 1740 near Sidhbali is beloved for its freshly baked breads, pastries, and wholesome meals that pair beautifully with its single-origin coffee •







‘MY MOTHER WAS MY FIRST INSPIRATION’

Calm at the board yet relentless in pursuit, **Viswanathan Anand** fondly known as the ‘Tiger of Madras’, has shaped the story of Indian chess like none other. India’s first Grandmaster and a five-time world chess champion, Anand’s journey spans eras, formats, and generations. From instinctive brilliance in the pre-computer age to strategic mastery in a data-driven world, he has evolved with the game while remaining true to its spirit. Today, as a player, mentor, author, and deputy president of FIDE, Anand continues to influence chess far beyond the board. In this conversation, he reflects on his journey – and the future of the sport.

Chess wasn’t mainstream in India when you began. Looking back, how did the game first find its way into your life?

I was taught chess by my mother when I was six years old, and that was kind of the spark, actually. I seem to have been fascinated by the game because my family noticed me going back to the chessboard voluntarily. I mean, six-year-olds don’t repeat things they don’t like, so that was a good sign. And I must have found the game fascinating in some way. That’s how I got started.

The nickname 'Tiger of Madras' speaks to both intensity and resilience. Who were your biggest inspirations in chess, and what lessons from them stayed with you through the years?

My mother was my first inspiration. And then amongst chess players, the world champions Bobby Fischer and Mikhail Tal were my heroes. In a sense, you subconsciously try to model your game on them, though I don't think I really succeeded fully. But that, and the players I played with, I would try to learn a little bit from them as well.

From becoming India's first Grandmaster to serving as deputy president of FIDE, you've witnessed chess transform dramatically. How did you adapt your mindset as the game moved from intuition-led preparation to deep computer analysis?

The funny thing is, it's probably the reverse. Once upon a time, preparation was very important because we had a chance to think. Now, computers give a lot of preparation, but they give it to everyone. So, how do you distinguish yourself from someone else? Actually, you distinguish yourself from the next player by working on your intuition. That is practising a lot, trying to understand what the computer is telling you, drilling down into the details—because that's how you develop your feeling for the game. And that's maybe the most important way to learn nowadays.

Early in your career, you were known as the 'Lightning Kid' for your speed and fearless play. Was there a particular game or opponent that truly changed how you saw chess?

You're constantly inspired. You're curious about many, many players. As long as somebody does something, you think, "Wait, that's interesting." That's a good habit to have for chess players, but it also very quickly becomes who you are. I think Tal and Fischer — their games were impressive because their whole story, and their styles, were complete for me. Having said that, there were multiple influences along the way.

In your book, 'Lightning Kid: 64 Winning Lessons from the Boy Who Became Five-Time World Chess Champion' (as told to Susan Ninan), you've shared many interesting insights. What prompted you to write the book?

One of the motivations for this book was that I thought my journey itself could be written for the younger

audience. And so, you have to rewrite the stories a little bit, highlight what they might connect with, and lessons they can learn. But in a sense, what I'm giving is not a prescription. It's more like.... This is what I faced, this is what I did, and make of it what you will. As long as you can relate to the feeling, at least it gives you a starting point.

Writing often invites a different kind of reflection than competition. Did revisiting your games and experiences change the way you view your own journey?

Inevitably, it provokes reflection. I've already had a chance to look back at my older games, and anything you revisit after five years shows you how much you've moved on, and that you're also a different person. Reflecting on old incidents, I realise that without my mother's advice to keep a diary, I might not have been able to recall things so accurately. It produces a lot of reflection. It fascinates me to think — My God, once upon a time, this is what I thought! I saw a lot for that age! All the memories come back, not only the moves, but also the feelings and everything around them. So that was very nice.

Winning the World Championship five times across three different formats is a rare achievement. What do you believe helped you stay relevant and competitive across changing eras and generations?

Constant adaptation is essential. You have to move along with the times. You have to see new trends coming. You see what other people are doing, and you constantly try to learn. Also, if you have a good network, friends collaborate with you. You get starting points and you go along. In fact, most of my learning came through casual conversation. It wasn't structured, it came from having friends and a good network.

Today, you remain deeply involved as a player, mentor, and ambassador of the game. What would be your for the young players?

I've always liked chess for different reasons, because you grow and change as a person, and now it's a mixture. The competitive aspect is important, it cannot be otherwise. You have to want to win. But nowadays there's a balance. I have a life outside chess, and I'm able to separate the two much more. Twenty years ago, a chess game was something I felt far more intensely. I'm also able to compare different periods

now. In the book, you'll often see me reflecting on many things. However, now there's a degree of detachment from the game, and that's very helpful when writing a book. When it comes to learning, the best way is the way you enjoy most. That said, not everything can be reduced to enjoyment. There are deadlines and problems to fix before a tournament. That's part of the joy as well. It's hard work, but we chose this life, didn't we? ●


Official Recognition

It was also on this day in 1946 that the United Nations Radio service was set up.




Radio Festival, Delhi





Where is your home town, and what makes it so special?



There are plenty but I would mention Loktak, the biggest freshwater lake in the Northeast, home to Keibul Lamjao, the world's only floating national park; Kakching Garden for lovers of nature; Khongjom War Memorial, which commemorates the warriors who gave their lives in the Battle of Khongjom (1891), in the Anglo-Manipur War; the Imphal War Cemetery, resting place of those who perished in the Second World War; and Iroisemba Zoological Garden, a safe space for endemic and endangered species, with an orchidarium boasting of hundreds of species of orchids.

I recommend **Shirui Hills** in Utkhrul district for their breathtaking natural beauty; the tranquil and picturesque **Singda Dam**, popular with hikers and picnickers; **Santhei Natural Park**, a biodiversity-rich and stunningly verdant haven a little out of Imphal, at the edge of which lies **Andro village**, a hub of Manipuri culture and heritage; and **Sangaithel Park** for a refreshing outdoors experience.





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
